Dr. Angelou left this world a better place with all she accomplished before her 2014 homegoing. NO to National Adjunct Walkout Day

UP is aware of a planned, nationally organized National Adjunct Walkout Day on February 25, 2015. UUP does not condone, support, or endorse this movement. We strongly advise that you not participate in National Adjunct Walkout Day. Please read the following thoroughly.

After consulting with UUP Legal Staff, our Statewide UUP President Fred Kowal issued an email to all UUP members on December 12, 2014. In it he explained the gravity of the situation from a legal position.

The following are four reasons State President Kowal listed that all UUP employees -- including adjuncts -- should not participate in National Adjunct Walkout Day:

1 Under New York State Law, no public employee or employee organization can instigate, encourage, or condone a strike or a similar action.

Participation in any such action (a strike or other concerted stoppage of work or slowdown by public employees) is barred by New York State Civil Service Law (aka, The Taylor Law).

JUUP members who participate in any such action, which would constitute an illegal strike under New York State Civil Service Law, could be subjected to loss of two days' pay for one day of action. If UUP were to be found to have encouraged a strike, we would face legal action potentially leading to the loss of agency fee.

Be aware that anyone on a term appointment (ex., non-permanent) could be subjected to Article 19 disciplinary action, up to and including termination. Employees on temporary appointments (ex., adjunct faculty) are at-will employees and could be terminated immediately.

While State UUP President Fred Kowal and Buffalo State Chapter President Rick Stempniak both support our adjunct brothers and sisters in their quest for a living wage and better working conditions, UUP cannot support, encourage, or condone the walkout.

nstead, UUP is working with the American Federation of Teachers to provide alternative actions that will promote and pursue the goals we have established in UUP: Bringing adjuncts into full-time status with job security and a living wage.
